The application for exchange students is an ONLINE-Application and no other application will be accepted.

The Access Code for the obligatory Online Application will exclusively be sent to students officially nominated by the partner university's International Office (first name, family name and E-Mail address).

- 2. The receiving institution will send its decision within 4 weeks.
- 3. A of Records will be issued by the receiving institution no later than [5] weeks after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI. [It should normally not exceed five weeks according to the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education guidelines]
- 4. Termination of the agreement

[It is up to the involved institutions to agree on the procedure for modifying or terminating the inter-institutional agreement. However, in the event of unilateral termination, a notice of at least one academic year should be given. This means that a unilateral decision to discontinue the exchanges notified to the other party by 1 September 2014 will only take effect as of 1 September 2014+1. The termination clauses must include the following disclaimer: "Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict."]

1. Grading systems of the institutions

The receiving institutions provide the statistical distribution of grades according to the descriptions in the ECTS users' guide7. The table will facilitate the interpretation of each grade awarded to students and will facilitate the credit transfer by the sending institution.

In the Spanish university system, each course unit is graded on a scale from 0 to 10 points, and each numerical grade corresponds to a qualitative grade as follows: Suspenso (Fail): 0- 4.9 - Aprobado (Pass): 5- 6.9 - Notable (Good): 7-8.9 - Sobresaliente (Very Good): 9-10 - Matricula de Honor: A special mention for outstanding performance limited to a maximum of 5% of students registered in a given course unit group. When a student does not take the corresponding examination or final assessment, this is reflected as No Presentado (Absent). To pass a course unit, a student must receive a grade of at least 5 points out of 10.
